Chair asked for explanation of what it means to be over the cap. Solicitor stated that all cities and towns, by State Law and Ordinance, are limited in the number of alcoholic licenses that can be issued and it is based on population. Under our Ordinance, we have a certain number of alcoholic beverage licenses and this particular application would put us over the number that is currently authorized. That requires, under the Ordinance, that the Safety Services and Licenses Committee make the recommendation to exceed the cap if it deems fit and that recommendation would need to go to the full City Council and it would require a 2/3 approval by the City Council and then the cap can be exceeded.

James Rutkovsky and **Ezra Spitzer-Williams**, applicants, appeared to speak. Peter Petrarca, Esq., appeared to represent applicants.

On motion by Council Vice-President Brady, seconded by Councilwoman Vargas, it was voted to recommend approval of this license application.

Under Discussion:

Attorney Petrarca stated that this location would be the third location for his clients. They have been in Providence and in Johnston for one year and they have had no issues and they cater to patrons between the ages of 25 and 40. They are looking to stay open 4 pm to 12:30 am. They had applied, but pulled, for an entertainment license. They are tremendous neighbors in the towns that they currently operate in.

No one from the public appeared to oppose.

Council President Paplauskas stated that he has a friend who lives near the Smith St. location and he was told that when he found out that this applicant had applied in Cranston, they said don't do it, you are going to have problems. He was also told that the neighbors at the Smith St. location had nothing but problems. That raises a red flag for him. There is a condo association next door to this location and they are very vocal. He has reservations on this application. If this is approved, he will request a six-month review.

Attorney Petrarca stated that they would welcome a six month-review He has not seen a Police report or an allegation regarding the Smith St. location.

Council Vice-President Brady stated that he is aware of these owners. He has watched them grow. Over the years, they have helped with philanthropic efforts. He welcomed them to the community. He also asked for recommendation on whether he can vote on this or not.

Councilwoman Germain asked what the implication would be to extending the cap. Solicitor stated that there is no implication. This is the discretion of the Committee. You would be sending it to the full City Council as a recommendation.

Councilwoman Vargas asked what the hours of operation would be. Mr. Rutkovsky stated 4 pm to 12:30 am, seven days a week. Councilwoman Vargas asked if there is any requirement that the neighbors have to be notified of this license application. Solicitor stated that notice requirement is 200' radius notification to abutters. Councilwoman Vargas stated that she is in favor of approving this as long as this is back for six-month review.

Council Vice-President Brady asked for clarification on whether or not he can vote on this. Solicitor stated that he does not see any reason why he couldn't vote on this, unless applicant has an objection. Attorney Petrarca stated that his clients have not objections.

Council President Paplauskas asked if there is a patio plan for this. Mr. Rutkovsky stated that they are working with the landlord now and have not had Traffic Engineer approve it.

On motion by Council President Paplauskas, seconded by Councilwoman Vargas, it was voted to recommend approval of this license application with a six-month review. Motion passed unanimously.
