Jay Bombadier, Jr., 41 Oak St., appeared to oppose to this license transfer application. He stated that his wife passed away in February from liver and kidney failure due to alcohol. This business is a very irresponsible owner. They would serve his wife 2-3 times a day several nips per day. They sold her alcohol coming into the establishment intoxicated. By them moving, they will be moving closer to the YMCA, to a school and a daycare.

Council Vice-President Brady stated that he would like to hear from the applicant why they are seeking this transfer of location.

Chad Kelliher stated that they are in a plaza and are pushed back in the plaza and they feel that they would get more exposure moving to the new location being actually on the street.

Council Vice-President Brady asked Solicitor, if legally, there is anything we can do based on the fact that they already have a license and are operating in the City. Is there any citation against them that would make us feel otherwise?

Solicitor stated that we are talking about transferring a location. That distinction is important. As to the citation question, he has not heard of any evidence whatsoever that this license holder has done anything wrong at all. He stated that he is sorry for Mr. Bombadier's loss, they did not know. They eventually stopped serving his wife and they never served her when she was inebriated.

Council President Paplauskas expressed sincere condolences to the Bombadier Family.

Council President Paplauskas asked if the Police Department has had any issues with this business in the past. He also asked the Clerk if they need any clearances. Major Quirk stated that there are none that he is aware of. Clerk indicated that applicant has all clearances he needs for the new location.

Councilwoman Germain asked Solicitor what kind of provisions they have to enhance before serving someone. Attorney Angell stated that they first have to make sure the person is of legal age, which is part of the TIPS training.

Solicitor stated that there are some provisions under the law which imputes the liability of the business entity that sells the liquor under certain circumstances. What we are talking about here is a completely different category, we are talking about someone who had a medical condition.

Major Quirk indicated that he checked back to 2019 on any issues with this establishment and nothing showed up to bring attention to the Police Department.

Councilwoman Vargas asked if the hours are going to be different at the new location then location currently. Mr. Kelliher stated that they were going to change the hours, but will keep them 9 am to 10 pm Monday thru Saturday and 10-6 on Sunday.
