SAFETY SERVICES & LICENSES COMMITTEE

Regular meeting of the Safety Services and Licenses Committee was held on Monday, November 14, 2022 in the Council Chambers, City Hall, 869 Park Ave., Cranston, Rhode Island.

MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

On motion by Councilwoman Vargas, seconded by Council President Paplauskas, it was voted to approve the minutes of the last meeting and they stand approved as recorded. Motion passed unanimously.

I. COMMITTEE BUSINESS MATTERS CARRIED OVER

CLASS BV LIQUOR LICENSE – NEW

Café Day Restaurant and Bar (Carlos Santos)

326 Union Ave.

(Cont. from 7/11/2022 for status update)

On motion by Councilwoman Germain, seconded by Councilwoman Vargas, it was voted to approve this license application.

Under Discussion:

Carlos Santos appeared to speak and stated that he is open for private parties right now. He will be opening to the public beginning of January.

No one appeared to oppose.

Chair asked Mr. Santos how the parking situation is. Mr. Santos stated that he partly parks across the street from the restaurant and they are fine for now.

Councilman Donegan stated that, as Councilman for this area, he has not received any complaints about anything that is going on at this business. He asked Mr. Santos if he has a parking plan in place. Mr. Santos stated that he does. As he stated, he is using parking across from the restaurant and also if he needs more spaces, he can speak to the business on the corner of Webster and Union and rent space from them. Councilman Donegan asked Solicitor that since that is in Providence, is that ok that the parking plan goes into another City. Solicitor stated that he does not see anything in the Ordinances or the Law that make it a prohibition necessarily. He does not know if it was done, but there should have been Traffic Engineer weighing in on the parking issue. He does not know if a report was done or not. Chair asked Clerk if there is anything from the Traffic Engineer. Clerk stated that she does not see anything, but believes he did sign off on the site plan. Solicitor stated that if Traffic signed off on it, he would then have to assume there is no issue.

Councilman Donegan asked Mr. Santos what the hours of operation are. Mr. Santos stated, 11 pm is going to be the latest and he is planning to close Mondays and open Wednesdays through Sundays. Councilman Donegan asked Mr. Santos, other than the Class BV, if he plans on applying for any other license. Mr. Santos stated that the only other one he was going to apply for was the Entertainment License, but he is not interested right now in applying for any other type of license.

Councilwoman Vargas asked Mr. Santos what time he would be open. Mr. Santos stated, noontime.

Mr. Santos asked if he is good to close at 11 pm because the permit was approved for 9 pm. Solicitor stated that he believes that there was a limitation in terms of closing time and he believes there was also a limitation on the number of patrons that could frequent the restaurant as well. He does not recall what that number was. Mr. Santos stated that it was sixty persons and the hours was from 11-9.

Councilwoman Vargas stated that since there have been no complaints, she does not have a problem extending the hours to 11 pm. Chair agreed. Councilwoman Germain agreed to extending the hours.

On motion by Councilwoman Germain, seconded by Council Vice-President Ferri, it was voted to remove restriction and approve hours from 12-11. Motion passed unanimously.

On motion by Councilwoman Germain, seconded by Council Vice-President Ferri, it was voted to approve the liquor license application. Motion passed unanimously.

PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENT LICENSE – RENEWAL

401 Night Life LLC d/b/a Pregame Lounge

(Cont. from 10/3/2022)

Solicitor stated that Attorney Hemond had a conflict and is in North Providence before their Council and may not be done in time to attend this meeting, but he has spoken to Mr. Hemond and he can resolve this for tonight's purposes. He stated that Pregame Lounge was Show Caused and we preliminarily shut them down back in March of this year for the shooting that took place outside that establishment. The Liquor License was revoked, the Entertainment License was revoked. The Liquor License revocation was appealed at DBR and there was an extensive hearing held at DBR and as he informed this Committee when we had our Executive Session at that time. DBR essentially reinstated the Liquor License subject to a Police Detail requirement. That was later modified by the Director to dispense with the Police Detail, however, the Director in her own words said she strongly recommended that they have a Police Detail on Friday, Saturday and Sunday nights. The Liquor License is not before the Committee. This is strictly the Entertainment License. We had an emergency Show Cause Hearing in March when we revoked both licenses. Since there was never a full fledged hearing on the Entertainment License, Attorney Hemond was asking for a full fledged hearing. What we have agreed to do is take the transcripts, the exhibits, everything that was submitted in front of the DBR and we are going to make it part of the record for this Committee to review. He is going to ask that we have an Executive Session, perhaps just before the Council meeting at the end of the month. This will give everyone time to review the transcript to see what evidence was presented by the City and by Attorney Hemond on behalf of his client, who is present this evening. The Committee will then decide what it wants to do. However the Committee decides, he is going to write a decision because we have to compile a record because if this is taken up to the Supreme Court, they are going to need something to review. In the meantime, he is suggesting that we proceed this way procedurally. He is going to put together with Attorney Hemond, a record of the proceedings that took place at DBR. He is also going to supplement that with any other reports that he has obtained from the Police over the past couple of years for complaints and responses down at the Pregame Lounge. This will all be put together for the Committee and the Committee will review that then let him know what they want to do at the Executive Session. He will then compile a written decision. We are not going to have a full blown hearing. What we are basically doing is we are piggybacking on the DBR hearing so we do not have to do this exercise twice. He is going to ask the Committee to make a motion to accept the record that was presented to DBR and make it part of the record here tonight. This is on for a renewal this evening, but because they are in a revocation status, there is nothing to renew so he is treating this and wants the Committee to treat this as "hearing" that Attorney Hemond was requesting and he is onboard with that.

Chair asked Solicitor that since the applicant is present this evening, does he get to speak this evening or would the Solicitor want to wait until after. Solicitor stated that Attorney Hemond requested ten days to submit his written position in any mitigating fact as he thinks are appropriate for the Committee to consider. He is going to ask that the Committee also allow him

ten days to do that. There are two aspects to the motion, one being, to accept the complete record from DBR and also to allow Attorney Hemond a period of ten days from tonight to submit his written position and mitigating factors and anything else he wants to include and then hopefully we can have the Executive Session prior to the Council meeting and then he will draft the decision based on what the Committee wants to do.

On motion by Council President Paplauskas, seconded by Council Vice-President Ferri, it was voted to have the Committee accept the record and testimony from DBR regarding this case and allow Attorney ten days to respond with his position. Motion passed unanimously.

VICTUALLING LICENSE – NEW

La Bandera Bistro (Yanelby Santos) (New Owner)

Yanelby Santos appeared to speak.

On motion by Councilwoman Germain, seconded by Councilman Campopiano, it was voted to approve this license application.

Under Discussion:

Ms. Santos stated that everything on her checklist is practically done. She has an appointment with the RI Department of Health this week, but she did submit all the paperwork and everything looks good. She also stated that she paid for all the fees and everything that she had to pay as well.

Chair deferred to the Solicitor.

Solicitor stated that he believes there were some outstanding issues in regards to liquor being sold and he had drafted a cease and desist letter and on the Victualling License, the last discussion that he had with the Clerk is approximately a month ago and there were certain conditions that needed to be met and the most important being the approval from the Department of Health. He asked Ms. Santos if he is correct in stating that she has not received the actual approval but that the paperwork is pending with the Department of Health. Ms. Santos stated that that is correct. She is just waiting for the Department of Health to come out this week and she is no longer serving liquor until further notice. She is just going to serve food for the time being. She will be appearing before this Committee on December 5th for the liquor license. They are not currently open. They are under renovation. Solicitor indicated to Ms. Santos that from a legal standpoint, for the protection of the City, the Committee cannot approve this until we get evidence from the Department of Health. We have, in the past, granted licenses and ratified the action after the fact, but that is a little risky if something were to happen in the interim, then this Committee would be on the chopping block from a legal standpoint. He can't say yes to go ahead and grant the license from a legal standpoint. It is up to the Committee. He would advise against it until we get something from the Department of Health. This could be continued to the December meeting and can be heard along with the liquor license application.

Council Vice-President Ferri asked Solicitor if the license can be approved pending applicant proving that she has the Health license and then she delivers that to the Clerk and at that time, she can open the food portion of the restaurant. Solicitor stated, yes, the Committee can do whatever it likes. From a legal standpoint, he advises against it only because he has not really seen any applications from the Department of Health. You would be taking a risk if something were to happen in the interim. He would think it would be permissible if the Committee would like to approve it subject to, but deferred to Attorney Angell. He also stated that that it is up to the Committee, but he is not totally comfortable with that.

On motion by Council President Paplauskas, seconded by Councilwoman Germain, it was voted to continue this license application to the December 5th meeting. Motion passed on a vote of 5-1. The following being recorded as voting “aye”: Councilwomen Germain, Vargas, Councilman Campopiano, Councilwoman Renzulli and Council President Paplauskas -5. The following being recorded as voting “nay”: Council Vice-President Ferri -1.

IV. PUBLIC HEARINGS and/ or NEW MATTERS BEFORE THE COMMITTEE

A. PUBLIC HEARINGS

Solicitor stated that for informational purposes, under Class BV Liquor License Renewals, Huy Hoang, LLC, d/b/a Pho Sai Gon & Bar is listed. Approximately a year or two ago, there was an incident regarding this business in serving an underage person that ended up being a fatal accident that night and as a result, he believes there was a Show Cause Hearing held with them and as a result of certain things he believes certain protections were added to ensure that no underage persons would be served alcohol at that establishment. Since that time, he has not been made aware, or not come to his attention that there has been any other further incidents regarding Pho Sai Gon and their liquor license. Barring any new information, he thinks it is safe to say that not renewing them would not be justified just based on that one prior incident, but it is on their record.

Chair asked if the Committee would be renewing them with the limitations that were set forth last time. Solicitor stated that he would take this establishment out of the block, if the Committee is going to approve the renewals as a block and renew that with the same conditions that were put into place when it was renewed in the prior year so that the same conditions carry forward. He does not have those minutes available this evening, but if the motion states the same conditions as the prior approval for the renewal last time, that would be fine.

Councilwoman Germain stated that the Committee should have those minutes because she does not know the details of the incident and the owner should be before the Committee to give an update. She does not feel comfortable to vote if there is an issue with that. She would like to have this continued and have the owner appear before the Committee. Solicitor stated that that would be a good idea, but his only concern would be he is not sure when the license expires and the next meeting is December 5th. According to the Clerk, the license expires December 1st. If we put this on for the December 5th meeting, then they would be four days without their BV license. After conferring with Attorney Angell, a better way to do this to avoid

that four day gap is to approve the renewal under the same conditions that were set in place at the prior Show Cause Hearing, put it on the December 5th agenda for status or review and at that point, we can bring in the file and the owner can be summoned in for December 5th. We can also check with the Police Department to see if there have been any other issues and if there are not any, then we can just pass it off the calendar and if there is an issue, then we can deal with it then and perhaps another Show Cause Hearing would be appropriate.

Solicitor stated that this is the establishment that was issued approximately seven Citations for selling tobacco to underage individuals and for the past two sessions of the Safety Services and Licenses Committee meetings, he has asked that the matter be continued to see what took place in Municipal Court. He has been in constant contact with Assistant Solicitor Orton and as of two Fridays ago, Mr. Saleem entered into a disposition in the Municipal Court as follows: he is pleading, he admitted to five of the violations and as a result, Judge Forte imposed a total amount of fines in the amount of \$2,500 for those violations. In addition, effective December 1st, the Tobacco License is going to be suspended for a period of thirty days. Given that disposition in the Municipal Court, speaking on behalf of the Administration and in his capacity as a Prosecutor, he is satisfied with that disposition, however, there is going to be one more Court date in the Municipal Court because there is one Citation that is being held in abeyance and if there are no further issues, that is going to be dismissed on that day. He would like this placed on the December 5th meeting agenda one more time for status just to see and to make sure that there are no more violations because that will affect how this Committee views the other licenses. The Court did impose a fairly severe action and he does not think this Committee needs to take any further action, but asked to place it on for the December 5th agenda just to be certain.
