Mayor Hopkins Announces Start Of Knightsville Revitalization Phase Two

On Monday, March 25, I announced that the city is moving forward with "Phase 2" of the Knightsville Revitalization Project. Phase 2 is an exciting focus and opportunity to invest in the infrastructure of Knightsville.

Planned work will include new pavement, stamped concrete sidewalks, new street lighting, trees, and sitting benches. Work will also make the sidewalk areas ADA compliant for improved and safe pedestrian access.

When complete, the area will come alive as a must visit destination with an economic corridor to be enjoyed by residents and visitors to our restaurants and businesses. Our plans include sidewalk bump out areas to allow enhanced outside dining experiences to be enjoyed at Knightsville spectacular local restaurants.

The scope of construction work for Phase 2 will include Cranston Street from Vervena Street north to the Randall Street intersection. It will also include part of Phenix Avenue starting at the end of Itri Park and then cross over to Park Avenue and continue easterly towards Southern Street.

Foregoing major complications, it is scheduled to be complete by mid-December of this year. I thank neighborhood residents for their patience and cooperation during the construction process. We will work to minimize interruption and inconvenience for neighborhood residents, but the nature of the work will call for everyone's understanding and cooperation.

This latest revitalization project is just one more concrete example of my commitment to local businesses as reflected in the work already completed in Rolfe Square and Pawtuxet Village.

Congratulations to our Cranston, RI Police Department on today's receipt of \$344,000 in government funding secured by Representative Seth Magaziner's office!

We are grateful to the Congressman, and State Rep. Jacquelyn Baginski, for their support securing this funding to replace four aged canine (K-9) transport and patrol police vehicles for three patrol dogs, as well as another critical member of our force - "CALI" the therapy-dog who comforts young victims of abuse in close partnership with the Hasbro Children's Hospital.

Our four-legged service members assist Cranston police officers in search and rescue operations of missing persons, search of property, and narcotic detection, among other essential duties.

I look forward to witnessing the work of our CPD and K-9 officers as we continue to strengthen the bond between our community and law enforcement.

Cranston Property Revaluation Notice

As required every three years by state law, Cranston has undergone a city-wide Property Revaluation, and has contracted Vision Government Solution, Inc. to complete the project.

Cranston Residents will receive a property assessment letter in the mail. Please refer to the information on the letter for any questions, such as scheduling a hearing regarding the new revaluation.

DO NOT APPLY THE CURRENT TAX RATE TO YOUR NEW ASSESSMENT.
THIS WILL RESULT IN AN INACCURATE CALCULATION OF FUTURE TAXES.
THE NEW RATE WILL BE DETERMINED IN THE SPRING OF 2024.

By law the city cannot receive more tax revenue because of revaluation. Citywide the total tax revenue will be the same. You can look up any property in Cranston by going on https://gis.vgsi.com/cranstonri/ or google vision appraisal Cranston.

Residents may schedule a hearing through Vision Government Solutions by calling 1-888-844-4300 or going online to: www.vgsi.com/schedules

The deadline to schedule an appointment with Vision Appraisal is April 11.
Then residents may contact the Cranston Tax Assessor's Office.

Informal phone hearings will be held by appointment only. The Representative from Vision Government Solutions, Inc. will contact you at your scheduled time.

In-person hearings will be held at the Cranston Senior Center.

Mayor Hopkins Announces Start of Yard Waste Collection

Mayor Hopkins reminds residents that starting **April 8th**, **and lasting into mid-December**, **2024**, Yard Waste may be picked up separately from other trash on regular collection days.

What is Yard Waste?

Yard Waste is organic material such as, but not limited to, leaves, grass clippings, hedge clippings, brush and branches and other small vegetative material that may be naturally biodegradable. In the case of tree branches and shrubs, the length of these items shall not be more than four feet.

What kind of container is acceptable?

Yard Waste must be placed in brown paper bags (no plastic bags) or corrugated boxes marked "Yard Waste" or barrels marked "Yard Waste." Branches must be bundled and no longer than 4-feet long and placed on the curb no later than 6:15 am on your collection day, but not before noon the day before.

Assistance Approved For Residents Affected by Dec/Jan Storms, Flooding



Mayor Ken Hopkins announced the Federal Emergency Management Agency and President Biden have approved the emergency declaration for December 2023 and January 2024 flooding events in Rhode Island.

Federal funding is now available to affected individuals and business owners in Kent, Providence, and Washington counties for damage from the Dec. 17–19, 2023, and the January 9-13 storm, which forced dozens of Rhode Islanders to evacuate their homes and apartments.

If your home or business was damaged during either storm, you can apply for assistance by calling 800-621-FEMA (3362), or going online to <u>DisasterAssistance.gov</u>.

Steps to apply

- Visit DisasterAssistance.gov

- Click, 'Get Assistance' and 'Apply Online' in the drop down menu

- Enter your zip code

- Select the date of the disaster that affected you **If you have losses in more than one event, you must complete a new application for each disaster**

- Select your area (Providence' county for Cranston residents)

- Follow final directions to file for property damage & other expenses
