Civilian Bravery Award

The Cranston Police Department and I recognized 12-year-old Seraphina who, on the evening of March 18, 2024, took courageous and quick action in waking her family and alerting emergency personnel to an active fire and events at a home next door - keeping others safe from potential danger.

The CPD invited Seraphina's family to headquarters for her to receive a civilian award for bravery. Seraphina's bravery serves as a shining example of selflessness and community spirit. The City of Cranston is proud to honor a hero who, at 12-years-old, showed that age is no barrier to making a difference.



Cranston Bike Path Renovations Near Complete

Paving and improvement work for Cranston sections of the Washington Secondary Bike Path is targeted to be complete in June!

Cyclists and pedestrians can look forward to a smoother and more enjoyable journey along the path with these improvements..

RIDOT began preliminary work on the bike path in April. Work has included drainage enhancements, repairs to washouts, striping, fence replacements, erosion controls, and improvements to pedestrian signals and ADA ramps at street crossings.

Throughout the summer, work will continue on bike path sections within the Towns of Coventry and West Warwick and the City of Warwick.

At my encouragement, work in Cranston is being completed first to allow maximum use of the bike path during the 2024 Spring and Summer seasons.

While the construction may lead to temporary closures during weekday nights, the long-term benefits of a revitalized and safer bike path far outweigh the inconvenience. This revitalization effort promises to provide a renewed space for outdoor recreation and leisure for all to enjoy for years to come.



New Maritime Pipe-Fitting Pathway at Cranston East

In April, we celebrated the official opening of the new plumbing and pipefitting CTE space at Cranston High School East. This pathway program will prepare students for careers in maritime pipefitting - many of the students in the program already have job offers with Electric Boat upon graduation!

The Cranston Public School program has partnered with Electric Boat and received Department of Defense funding from Southeastern New England Defense Industry Alliance (SENEDIA) for new equipment allowing students to complete realworld, hands-on projects in plumbing/pipefitting.

A special recognition goes to instructor Chris Richards who trained with Electric Boat himself to become certified to lead this brand-new maritime pipe-fitting program!
